

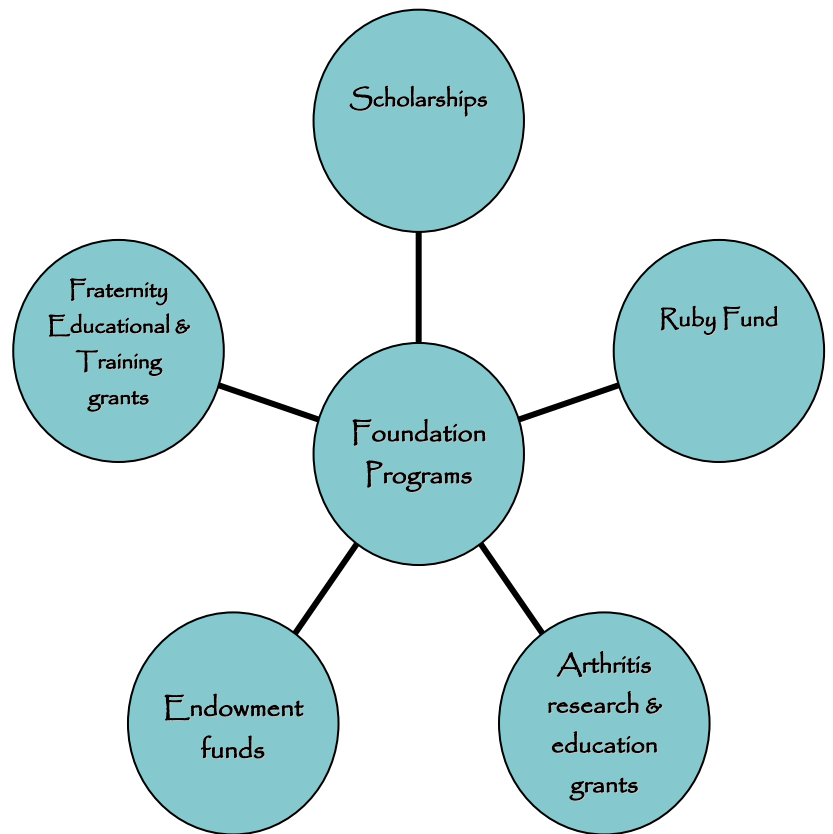
ALPHA OMICRON PI FOUNDATION

The Foundation Board includes a president, vice-president, secretary, 4 board directors, as well as the Fraternity International President.

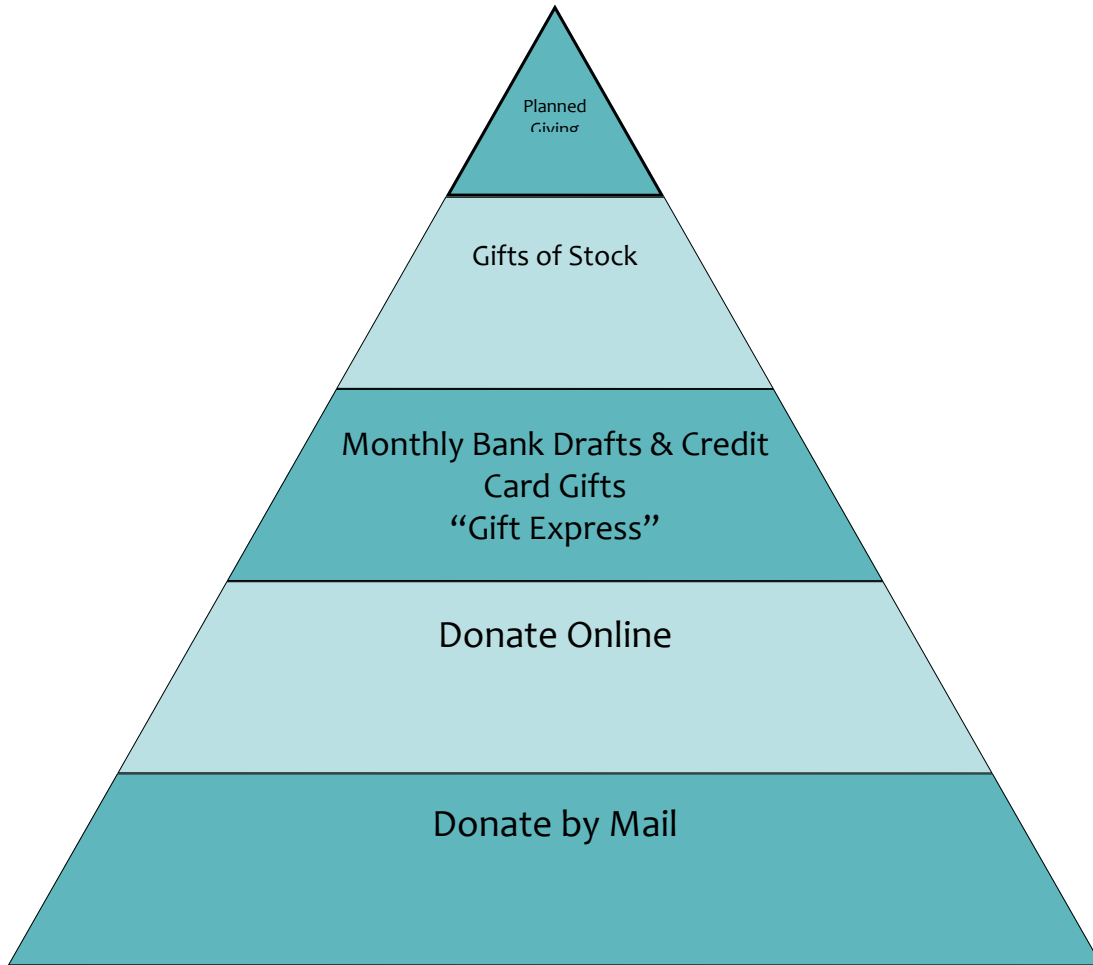
The Foundation staff consists of an executive director, development & marketing manager, donor relations specialist, controller and two administrative coordinators.

Arthritis research grants:

- A total of \$91,500 has been awarded for two research projects for 2009-2010.
- Arthritis mini-grants of \$20,944 were awarded for local arthritis program support in the communities where AOII chapters raised these funds.
- Arthritis walks with AOII teams raised \$7,025!

Juvenile Arthritis (JA Alliance) educational grants:

- A total of \$20,000 for family scholarships and children's activities were awarded at the national JA Alliance conference. Pandas were also donated through the Panda Project for children.

For your chapter to receive credit for your Strike Out Arthritis! event, funds must be sent directly to the Foundation. When submitting your funds & report form, please send to the attention of Courtney Stafford at the Foundation. Mini-grants can be written to your local arthritis organization with submission of funds & report form to the Foundation.

Information on arthritis mini-grants:

The Foundation mini-grant program enables local AOII chapters to direct their arthritis funds through the Foundation, and back to a local arthritis program, camp or project. The chapter receives giving credit with the Foundation and consideration for AOII awards. Last year an additional \$20,944 in Foundation arthritis mini-grants were given back to local communities.



Foundation Scholarships

Application Process



Step 1: Go to the website after October 1st for a current scholarship application. Complete the two page application and narrative page online, typed or printed in black ink. Do not recreate the application or leave anything blank.

Step 2: One completed recommendation form from a member of Alpha Omicron Pi. An additional recommendation is requested from an advisor, if the applicant is a collegian. The provided form must be used and enclosed in a sealed envelope for submission. Please ask the sender to sign the sealed envelope.

Step 3: One letter of reference from a professor who knows you personally. The letter of reference must be on university letterhead and placed in a sealed envelope for submission. Please ask the sender to sign the sealed envelope for submission. If you have been out of school for more than three years you can have a current employer write your letter of reference.

Step 4: Place all of the above information in an envelope with correct postage and mail to the address below no later than March 1st.
